How to Clean a Bathroom



- 1. Gather supplies:
 - Cloths designated to clean bathrooms, paper towels or sponges
 - Cleaning supplies
 - Always read and follow the directions listed on the label for cleaning solutions.
 - Make sure cleaner is appropriate for the job you're doing and the surface you're cleaning.
 - Never mix two chemicals. This can produce toxic gas. For example, never mix chlorine bleach and ammonia.
 - Do not use bleach.
 - Toilet brush
 - Gloves
- 2. Clear the bathroom of clutter and items that do not belong.
- 3. Pour disinfectant into the toilet bowl. Put the toilet brush inside the bowl to sanitize it for cleaning. Let it sit while you work on another part of the bathroom.
- 4. Ensure proper ventilation by opening the door or turning on a fan.

- 5. If available, sprinkle the sink with scrubbing powder. Let it sit for 10-15 minutes to help work loose any dirty spots.
- 6. Spray cleaning product on the shower walls and shower head. Let it sit for a couple of minutes, then rinse.
- 7. Clean the sink and the counter area. Scrub any soap scum and tooth paste off with a small amount of cleaner, rinsing your cloth, towel or sponge frequently.
- 8. Clean the mirror. Use cleaner, rinse it and wipe the excess water off with a paper towel.
- 9. Clean the toilet.
 - Wipe the flush handle.
 - Thoroughly wash and rinse all exterior surfaces on the toilet bowl, including the underside and flared base, the top and underside of the seat and lid, and the hinges and their mounting area.
 - Scrub the bowl with a toilet brush and flush.
- 10. Sweep floor.
